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An Overview Of The Overseas Investment Regime In Zealand

New Zealand is an attractive destination for overseas investors due to its ease of doing business and its stable economy and political climate. Whilst New Zealand might be small, there are ample business opportunities for solid growth.

New Zealand has a 'common law' system inherited from England. The system is similar to that found in many British Commonwealth countries and comprises statute law made by Parliament, supplemented by a collection of common law or case law made by courts.

The New Zealand Court system has four tiers: District Court, High Court, Court of Appeal and Supreme Court. In addition to the Courts, New Zealand has a large number of specialist tribunals and bodies.

Overseas entities proposing to set up business in New Zealand have four main structures available to them:

- (i) register a branch,
- (ii) form a subsidiary company,
- (iii) acquire an existing New Zealand company, or
- (iv) form a partnership, including a limited partnership.

An overseas company wishing to register a branch in New Zealand must reserve its name with the Registrar of Companies and file an application for registration within ten working days of commencing business in New Zealand. Companies incorporated in New Zealand are registered under the Companies Act 1993. A company must have at least one shareholder and one director. At least one director of a New Zealand company must either be resident in New Zealand or be resident in an enforcement country and a director of a company incorporated in that enforcement country. At present only Australia has been confirmed as an enforcement country.

A company considering merging with or buying a New Zealand company must be aware of the restrictions on business acquisitions contained in the Commerce Act 1986 and the Overseas Investment Act 2005. If the New Zealand company is listed on the New Zealand Stock Exchange, or has more than 50 shareholders, the Takeovers Code is also likely to apply. It is therefore imperative for investors to seek legal and other professional assistance to ensure that such transactions may be materialized in an effective and efficient manner.

In New Zealand, foreign investment is mainly regulated by the Overseas Investment Act 2005 and the Overseas Investment Regulations 2005. Most investments by "overseas persons" in "significant business assets" or "sensitive land" will require the Overseas Investment Office's ('OIO') consent.

What is the definition of an overseas person? An overseas person is broadly defined to include an individual not an ordinary resident in New Zealand, any company incorporated outside New Zealand, and any entity where more than 25% of any class of its securities is owned or controlled by persons who are not New Zealand citizens or entities that are themselves overseas persons.

An investment by overseas person in significant business assets is:

- the acquisition of a 25% or more ownership or control interest in a New Zealand company (or an increase in an existing 25% interest) where the consideration paid, or the assets of the New Zealand company, exceeds NZ\$100 million;
- the acquisition of property (including goodwill and other intangible assets) in New Zealand used for carrying on business in New Zealand where the total consideration exceeds NZ\$100 million, whether by one or a series of related or linked transactions; or
- the establishment of a business in New Zealand which is carried on for more than 90 days in any year, consecutively or in aggregate, where the total expenditure incurred before commencing the business exceeds NZ\$100 million.

An investment by an overseas person in sensitive land is the purchase or lease of an interest in non-urban land over five hectares, certain significant land and residential land.

Certain non-government investors from companies with overseas investment treaties with New Zealand have the benefit of higher monetary thresholds before consent is required to an investment in sensitive business assets. For example, Australia's monetary threshold in 2020 is NZ\$537 million. Other countries, such as Mainland China, Canada, Singapore and other countries have a threshold of NZ\$200 million.

The law of overseas investment changes from time to time. Last year, the Overseas Investment Act 2005 was amended by the Overseas Investment (Urgent Measures) Amendment Act 2020 due to Covid-19, with new measures such as the new national interest test and the new temporary notification power for the OIO being introduced. The ever-changing nature of the Overseas Investment Regime in New Zealand means that it is important for investors to clearly understand their obligations, including by seeking legal advice. Note: Public tenders in New Zealand are in principle opened for overseas investment. That said, most foreign investors may not be eligible for want of local experience and capability in the relevant sectors. Foreign investors thus tend to invest in private transactions and projects.

Turkey News Express Of Foreign Investment Environment And Industrial Investment

- ◆ U.S.-based multinational banking and financial services company JP Morgan on February 12th revised its estimate for Turkey's economic growth for 2020 from 1.1% to 1.9%. According to a report published by the firm, despite containment measures such as lockdowns, domestic demand was quite resilient in the fourth quarter of 2020. Underlining the country's experience in handling crises in previous years, the report highlighted it was not particularly surprising that Turkey outshined its peers amid the coronavirus pandemic. One of the main reasons for this outperformance was the massive government-led credit growth in the first half of last year, supporting the economy to recover from the pandemic.
- ◆ Moody's on February 24th revised Turkey's economic growth forecast to 1.1% for 2020 from a 5% contraction and 3.5% for 2021 from 4%. According to a report published by Moody's, the country's rate for 2022 was also revised up from 4% to 5%. The report noted gross domestic product (GDP) is expected to increase in all G20 economies.
- ◆ The Turkish Treasury borrowed some 6.7 billion Turkish liras (\$963 million) from domestic markets on Feb. 15, an official statement said. Turkey's Treasury and Finance Ministry announced that some 1.6 billion Turkish liras (\$229 million) in floating rate note bonds reopen, semiannually were sold in the first auction. The Treasury bill will be settled Wednesday and mature on Nov. 17, 2027. The total tender amounted to 2.7 billion Turkish liras (\$388 million) with a 59.8% accepted/tendered rate.

- ◆ Automakers in Turkey produced 106,176 vehicles including automobiles and commercial vehicles this January, according to a sectoral report on February 14th.Turkey's auto production fell 3 percent on a yearly basis, said the Automotive Manufacturers Association. Some 73 percent of the manufactured vehicles were exported, marking a 14 percent annual decline to 77,569 units last month. The country's earnings from automotive exports totaled \$2.3 billion in January, down 6 percent from a year ago. The association also said Turkey's overall auto sales market grew 61 percent year-on-year to 45,230 vehicles in the month.
- ◆ Turkish banks could receive up to \$3 billion in renewable energy financing to support the continuation of clean energy capacity in the country, Director at Garanti BBVA Investment Banking and Finance, Emre Hatem, told Anadolu Agency in a recent interview.

With around \$3 billion in renewable energy financing in Turkey last year, renewable capacity rose to nearly 49 gigawatts (GW) with the addition of around 4,900 megawatts (MW), which marked a record-high increase, according to Turkey's Energy and Natural Resources Ministry data. Turkey saw growth in biomass capacity with over 300 MW coming online in 2020, but this year it is expected to rise significantly to around 400 MW.

Unlicensed solar capacity also grew by 400 MW in 2020 and a similar amount of unlicensed solar capacity is forecast to come online this year, thanks to the increasing number of rooftop installations across the country. 4,500 MW of additional renewable energy capacity is expected to come into operation and the sector could attract around \$3 billion this year through the continuation of the banks' support for clean energy. Mini solar Renewable Energy Resource Zones (YEKA) tenders, totaling 1,000 megawatts (MW) in capacity for 36 regions across the country, would constitute a significant part of new projects in 2021. Companies with an energy portfolio of over 200 MW have started to put public offerings on their agenda this year.

- ♦ Wind's share in Turkey's monthly electricity generation passed 10 percent threshold for the first time in January, the energy and natural resources minister said on February. 23rd. Turkey's current installed wind capacity is forecast to reach 10,000 megawatts (MW) by the end of this year, marking an increase of around 1,200 MW. Wind power meets around 8.5 percent of the country's total electricity generation and is estimated to replace \$1 billion worth of natural gas imports. In 2020, hydropower plants provided 25.6 percent of the total generation while natural gas plants supplied 22.7 percent. Imported coal plants generated 22.3 percent, while wind, solar and geothermal plants generated 15 percent and lignite plants produced 12.5 percent. The remaining 1.9 percent of the generation came from other fuels like fuel-oil and bioenergy.
- ◆ Turkey will start using gas from the Sakarya Gas Field in the Black Sea in the first quarter of 2023, government sources told Anadolu Agency on February 11th. Turkey's first national drillship Fatih discovered 405 billion cubic meters (bcm) of natural gas last year in the country's largest discovery ever in its history and the biggest offshore gas discovery worldwide in 2020 at the Tuna-1 well located about 170 kilometers off Turkey's Zonguldak coast. First gas production from the field will start in 2023 to be delivered to Filyos, a coastal town in the Zonguldak province through a 150-kilometer-long subsea pipeline that Turkey will construct to run from the field to onshore where it will be connected to Turkey's national gas grid. The Sakarya gas field discovery is enough to meet the country's gas demand for around eight years based on its annual natural gas consumption of around 50 bcm.

Tendering And Bidding Projects News

Canal Istanbul

This year Turkey will open a tender for the mega-project Canal Istanbul, an artificial sea route parallel to the Bosphorus set to connect the Black Sea to the Sea of Marmara, a senior Turkish official said on Feb. 26. The construction of Canal Istanbul, with a daily passage capacity of 185 vessels, is expected to start in 2020 and be completed in 2025-2026. The planned 45-kilometer (28-mile) canal will be built west of the city center on the European side of the Istanbul province.

◆ The 2021 Performance Program of Turkish State Railways (TCDD) General Directorate encompassing the targets in the Railway Sector

According to the program, infrastructure works of high speed railway lines are targeted to be completed at a rate of 10%, superstructure works at a rate of 16%, electrification works at a rate of 10% and signalling works at a rate of 10% in 2021 within the scope of the completion of 1900 km of high speed train lines in addition to the lines already in operation aiming the completion of the high speed train railway network. 658 km of High Speed Railway lines are also targeted to be completed in addition to the lines in operation. An investment of TL 4.4 billion is foreseen to be made in 2021 to achieve said targets. The Build-Operate-Transfer (BOT) model is being considered as an alternative financing model in the Railway Sector and tenders realized with the bargaining method with the condition of securing loans was on the agenda last year.

13th Electricity Distribution Companies Sector Assessment Meeting

Energy and Natural Resources Minister Fatih Dönmez stated that a total investment of TL 66.7 billion is planned to be made in the electricity distribution network between 2021 and 2025 which is the fourth

implementation period. A separate budget item has been entered for the first time for planned maintenance services in addition to investments to be made in the fourth implementation period. Planned maintenance services were previously being covered by the operation budget. A budget of TL 10.5 billion has been assigned for planned maintenance services. Dönmez stated that a budget of TL 1 billion has been assigned for R&D activities for the next 5 years said that the budget for the current year is TL 185 million.

Ministry of Energy and Natural Reources (MENR), Pumping Storage Gökçekaya HEPP Project

The Ministry of Energy and Natural Resources (MENR) has conducted credit talks with JICA, the overseas state agency of Japan, for securing foreign credit financing of the project, has engaged in talks with the Ministry of Treasury and Finance on how foreign credit financing can be found for the project. When export credit involved, a tender with a credit condition may be considered. Under the circumstances, companies to bid in the international tender may bring export credit proposals from their own countries. For the Ministry of Treasury and Finance to carry a detailed study on securing foreign credit, first of all, negotiations on JICA credit and export credit bringing efforts of European companies have to be clarified. Besides Japanese companies having the most advanced technologies in the world, Austrian Andritz in Europe and General Electric (GE) of USA are interested in Pumping Storage PHEPP Projects. It is reported that technologies of some companies of Peoples Republic of China are also involved.

AYGM, Aydıncık Marina Construction Project

An objection application has been made to PPA on the tender result. The tender was awarded to Kınay İnşaat, the second-lowest bidder (among the valid bids), an objection application has been made by Potenza İnşaat, who did not consider the answer of the administration sufficient, to Public Procurement Authority (PPA).

Brazil New Regulations Express Of Foreign Investment In Energy Field

Offshore Wind Power Bill (n. 576/2021)

The Federal Senate received, on February 24, a bill that aims to open the path for investments in projects for the generation of energy in high seas, with strong potential for the exploitation of wind power in the northeast region of Brazil. The legal framework defines a contracting model very similar to one that already exists for the oil and gas sector, utilizing mechanisms such as subscription bonuses and royalties for the Federal Union, States and Municipalities. In order to facilitate new investments, the bill adopts the authorization regime, far less complex and bureaucratic than the public concession regime.

The potential investor will have two ways of obtaining the authorization: (i) through an independent grant, in which the investor can choose the areas of its best interest and, after elaborating a technical and economic study, require the authorization to the Brazilian National Agency of Electric Energy; (ii) through a planned grant, in which the investors will have to take part in a public bidding proceeding and the one with the higher subscription bonus proposal will be awarded the authorization.

The process includes analysis by the National Development Bank (BNDES) and the participation of society and the market through public hearings. Finally, the tender notice will be sent to the Federal Court of Accounts (TCU) and released for auction as soon as it is approved by the Court.

The advisor will review the potential bidders profile and upon their approval will prepare an investment teaser (or information memorandum), which will be circulated to all approved potential buyers (for a listed company, generally, the advisor will be publicly announced). Interested parties may submit their letter of intent ("LOI")s to the advisor (generally, an investment teaser contains the LOI template) andwe can advise on the requirements and structure of the LOI. The advisor will screen the candidates after their LOI submission. The selected group of potential buyers will make a preliminary due diligence deposit and proceed with their preliminary due diligence. Then, the advisor receives bids from the potential buyers who wish to continue and selects one or a pool of preferred bidders in consultation with the seller.

Once due diligence is completed the parties will negotiate and execute the relevant agreements to consummate the transaction. For interest in deals listed as "In Progress" we may provide additional details upon signing of a non-disclosure agreement that may be provided by the relevant M&A Advisor.
